
I would also like to thank Josh Cooper and the members of the APC for delivering what promises to be an exciting and challenging season of plays for 2016.

So it is with the selection of a new Kelvin season, where several potentially interesting options must make way to accommodate a balanced selection of plays.

Having said this, I feel that the APC have chosen another exciting and stimulating season for the club which will offer the membership a wide range of opportunities.

As always we offer our thanks to all directors who proposed a play this year, and we had to whittle down 14 proposals for the 5 available slots. Without these proposals, we would have nothing to debate and, whilst I know some directors will be disappointed not to have been chosen on this occasion, I for one am proud that Kelvin has such strong reserves of established and developing directing talent which keeps the club in a strong position and the quality of productions impressively high.


There were several plays we didn't select despite the APC all really enjoying them, and as ever the balancing of the season is very tricky and I hope my Jester article in the last issue helped you to understand the large number of factors we have to consider.

"A Wealth of Possibilities"

The 2016 season offers a wealth of possibilities for many different types of performers. Across the 5 plays there are 19 female roles, 17 male roles, a chorus, 3 puppeteers and a violinist! The roles cover a range of ages and we have two new directors entering the fray.

Interestingly this year all of our submissions were of plays written post-1950. However, we still have 3 period pieces, a dark modern play, a classic adaptation, a work by one of Britain's most famous living playwrights, a large fish being gutted on stage, a modern medieval epic, an accessible comedy drama, a politically tinged tragedy and a big family Christmas show.

The season is as follows:





The 2016 Season

February 2016 – A Black Box Double Bill

The River by Jez Butterworth (dir. Sam Skelton) – a poetic and mysterious modern play by the author of Jerusalem.

Orphans by Dennis Kelly (dir. Craig Malpass) – a powerful and dark morality tale which asks questions about modern attitudes to race and social care.

As before, the Black Box production will continue to utilize cast members from one production as technical crew on the other to expand Kelvin members skill sets, and each of the new directors will have an experienced mentor to assist them in their development.

NB. Both of these plays are just over an hour long and given they are published plays we are not able to cut them down. Given the length restrictions of performances at the Bristol One Act festival we cannot enter either of these plays, so regrettably we will not be entering the festival this year.

April 2016

The Secret Rapture by David Hare (dir. Bob Havard) – first performed by Kelvin in 1995, this modern family tragedy remains relevant today as it explores the impact of a Conservative government on private interests and personal relations.

July 2016

Di & Viv & Rose by Amelia Bullmore (dir. Jacqs Graham) - a heartwarming and funny look at the developing friendship of three women from university to middle age.

October 2016

James III: The True Mirror by Rona Munro (dir. Mary McCallum) – touring professionally in early 2016, this will be one of the first non-professional productions of the final part of the National Theatre of Scotland's highly acclaimed historical trilogy.

December 2016

A Christmas Carol by Charles Dickens adapted by Neil Bartlett (dir. Robin Turner) – Using a strong ensemble cast, musicians, puppeteers and a script taken directly from the original text, this adaptation promises to be a popular family Christmas entertainment.

Probable Matinee performances on Saturday & Sunday of run.

I would like to thank the mostly new APC for their hard work reading, circulating and discussing of plays together and with the directors at pitching. Without their counsel we'd probably have a load of avant-garde tosh that I like.

I would like to conclude by saying that the 2017 Kelvin season is now open for submissions! As with this year the deadline for proposals will be 1st May 2016.

Keep your eyes peeled in the Jester & Digest for a potential idea for a themed season for 2017 in the next few months.

Insider's Look

The Ultimate Guide to the Backstage World

It has been suggested that members might like to have a little of an overview of things that happen behind the scenes.

Many members don't get involved much 'backstage' and it was thought beneficial to let people know how things work so that there is more of an understanding of roles and procedures. Anna Wills is working with me and Robin to update the production pack (available on Members' website) and as an initial salvo has prepared a document setting out ideal departmental structures and roles. It's a big document so I'm going to drip feed you.

Here's the way the Role Descriptions might look:

Role Descriptions

These Role Descriptions are in line with professional commercial theatre and are intended as a guideline. Should any Kelvin Creative, Production or Stage Management Teams wish to reallocate and/or combine responsibilities, that is entirely at their discretion but all roles do need to be assigned in some form.

The Production Team

Production Manager

The Production Manager is responsible for overseeing the work of the production team in the lead up to the show. They schedule and lead all production meetings and liaise with both creative and stage management teams to ensure that everything is moving forwards. The Production Manager is responsible for creating the production schedule from get-in to get-out and is responsible for overseeing all of the practical/technical departments. The

Production Manager will be required for the rig, focus and plot sessions and will jointly lead the technical rehearsal with the Director Stage Manager and DSM. During the tech:

- The Director flags up/deals with any element requiring creative input, for example cues happening too early or any tweaks to the sound or lighting states required.
- The Stage Manager flags up/deals with any element back stage that needs attention, such as quick changes, props placement, scene changes etc.
- The production manager flags up/deals with any technical elements of the show such as doors not opening properly in the set, problems with lights or sound equipment etc.
- The DSM communicates with the various operators to cue them appropriately and to keep them up to speed during stops with where we are in the script, what we're doing and then picks up the cues once ready to move on.

The Production Manager should receive rehearsal and show reports and be responsible for passing on actions to the relevant departments. Should a show move from one venue to another, the Production Manager will often be responsible for co-ordinating this.

Wardrobe Department

The head of wardrobe is responsible for taking the designs and ideas from the costume designer and making them a reality. The wardrobe department is responsible for making, buying and hiring any elements of costume required. For this reason, measurements of cast and fittings will be led by wardrobe and arranged via liaison with the Stage Manager. The roles of costume designer and head of wardrobe department are often combined.



Construction Manager

The Construction Manager is responsible for taking the designs and ideas produced by the set designer and making them a reality. The construction manager leads their construction team to build any scenery and large props and liaises with the lighting and sound designers if any 'practicals' are required. (A practical is a lighting or sound fixture which is part of the set but which actually works for example wall light fittings in a room set which need to light up.) In the Kelvin scenario, the construction manager should have a good understanding of flattage and other basics owned by the club which can be re-used, and re-dressed.

Construction Team

The construction team work with the construction manager to build elements of the set.

Chief LX

The Chief LX (chief electrician) is responsible for taking the design and ideas from the lighting designer. The term electrician used in this context simply refers to someone responsible for the electrical elements rather than a qualified electrician. The Chief LX will ensure that the hanging plot is adhered to during the rigging session and will often lead the practical elements of the focus session. The Chief LX will also be responsible for the patch plan and hiring of any additional lanterns and effects required for the show. Pyrotechnics, haze and smoke also fall under this remit. The Chief LX will be responsible for plotting cues into the desk during the plot session. The Roles of Lighting Designer and Chief LX are often combined.

Board Op

The Board Operator will operate the lighting desk during a performance. The Board Op will be cued by the DSM and will also be responsible for warming the up the lanterns

and performing a lamp check prior to each performance. They may also be responsible for powering up and powering down the dimmers.

Head of Sound

The head of sound sometimes reports to the Chief LX as part of their department and sometimes does not. The Head of Sound is responsible for running any speaking or xlr cabling required to transmit sound from the desk to any speakers positioned in and around the auditorium. This may well be fixed for most productions but there may also be the necessity for speakers to be placed within the set (practicals as previously mentioned) and the Head of Sound will be responsible for this. The Head of Sound will also be responsible for setting levels of any sound and music cues during the plot session.

Sound Op

The Sound Operator with operate the sound during a production, both operating sound sources such as CD players of i-pods and mixing cues using the sound desk. The sound op may also be responsible for powering up and powering down any racks and equipment required each night. In the case of Kelvin, the sound operator also makes auditorium announcements. (Back stage calls, front of house calls and audience announcements would usually be done by the DSM).

Paint Shop / Scenic Art

The paint shop/ or scenic artists are responsible for following the designs created by the set designer and making them into reality. This can involve painting/decorating pieces of scenery built by the construction team, painting and decorating any hand-made props and painting floors and cloths.

There is still tons to be done with improving the building constantly. If you see anything that niggles, let me know (except for installing the washing machine!).

Diligent Digest Editor, Bob Havard, has a reminder for how to make use of Kelvin's e-mail updates.

The Digest, as its title implies, is a digest of news that may be of interest to members.

It sends out news about Kelvin, and Kelvin events, requests for support on our shows, Rehearsed Readings, other non-professional company shows, training and learning opportunities, casting opportunities in other companies, film and TV, and more.

The news items need to be fairly short, and to the point. If submissions are longer than half a page of A4, I may get back to the author, if time allows, or get my virtual scissors out and cut or precis an item.

On occasion, my pedantic streak comes out and corrects spellings, or gets back to the author when key information seems to be missing.

I usually send out Digest on most Sunday mornings. The deadline for items is midnight on Saturday. On rare occasions, late or urgent news can go out during the week in Interim Digests.
